## **STEM Stars Visit Jet Propulsion Laboratory**

Our STEM Stars visited Jet Propulsion Laboratory in Pasadena on December 20. STEM Stars are former Tech Trekkers who are invited to talks and field trips to help keep their interest in science and technology sparking.

The 18 STEM Stars attending the field trip already knew that JPL sent rovers to Mars. The field trip gave them the opportunity to learn more about the rovers, our missions to other planets in the solar system, and Earth observing instruments. They had tours of our historic Mission Control building (we call this the Center of the Universe), and the Mars Yard where we practice maneuvers that we plan to make on Mars. They also visited the largest clean room west of the Mississippi where many of JPL's spacecraft are built.

The highlight of the tour were presentations by three engineers who talked about their work, their educations, and their career paths to JPL. So inspiring!

Here are what two of the STEM Stars said:

"I went to the Stems Stars field trip..., and I wanted to tell you how grateful I am for allowing myself and other former Tech Trek participants to get involved in such a scientific, dynamic environment. Thank You! I know that I want to be an engineer in the future, and that I want to get a PhD, however I am struggling to decide what type of engineer should I be since there are so many incredible choices to choose from. But thanks to the presentations given to me at the JPL field trip, I now know what kind of paths I can approach to reach my goals. Thank You!"

"I wanted to thank you for allowing me the chance to explore around and learn more about space exploration and career opportunities in science that are open for women. ....All the people that helped out with the field trip...work very hard and it was very generous of them to come out of their way to enhance the education of us girls. It was such a fascinating experience!"

This is why we do what we do! I can see the future in the reflection of the girls' eyes. It is so wonderful to be able to help create an experience like this for them.

We had a lot of JPL helpers participating to make this a success. Kudos to all of them and to our drivers: Jeneywyn Van Wie, Charlotte Judson, Marie Pierre, and Stephanie Dietrich.




