Welcome to another year of wonderful programs and celebrating women who are rising and shining.

What a truly special annual membership brunch we had! We had two wonderful speakers, one who increased our knowledge of space exploration and the other who told us of her life on the prairie. I want to give *A Big Thank You* to my wonderful hospitality committee led by Tami Reyna. And to all the members and guests who attended the event.

AAUW continues the focus on ensuring economic security for women everywhere. They hit a major milestone in a partnership with the Coca-Cola Foundation to teach women everywhere to negotiate effectively. Coca Cola pledged \$100,000 if they trained 100,000 women by the end of this year. As of August 23, AAUW has trained 103,656 women to ask for the

The Brandon Hall awards are considered the most prestigious awards for learning and development in the United States. If you haven't yet, take a look at it online.

Another focus this year is increasing our membership. The California State Board is encouraging branches to establish a membership goal for this year. And those branches that have the highest increase in their membership numbers or percentage increase will be recognized at the state convention. In past years we had as many as 23 new members. During the Trump administration, the usual ways of conducting diplomacy have been upended.


Many positions in the State Department have never been filled, and meetings with foreign leaders such as Kim Jong-un and Vladimir Putin have been undertaken with little advance planning.
