# Guess Who Originally Discovered the Coronavirus . . . A Woman!

Scientific pioneer June Almeida is finally being acknowledged for virology breakthroughs she made a half-century ago. June's work has come roaring back into focus during the present pandemic.

COVID-19 is a new illness but it is caused by a coronavirus of the type first identified by Dr. Almeida in 1964 at her laboratory in St Thomas's Hospital in London. Her paper to a peer-reviewed journal was rejected "because the referees said the images she produced were just bad pictures of influenza virus particles."

June Almeida died in 2007, at the age of 77. Now 13 years after her death she is finally getting the recognition she deserves as a pioneer whose work sped up an understanding of the virus that is currently spreading throughout the world.

Perhaps a woman will discover a cure for COVID-19!
