

## **National Proposed Change in Dues**

The AAUW National Board of Directors will consider and vote on a change in Individual Member dues at their upcoming Board meeting on October 16, 2020. Any increase would take effect on July 1, 2021. The Board will consider two different options:

- A. An increase to take effect on July 1, 2021, of an amount between \$3 and \$10
- B. An increase to take effect on the 1st of July of each of the next three fiscal years of between \$3 and \$10 each year

# Don't Get Frustrated! Your Guide to Zoom

# **Zoom Training and Assistance**

For those members who do not or have not used Zoom, we are setting up some Zoom Training and Practice sessions prior to our September 26th Membership Meeting. If you have tried Zoom before and had mixed results, this is for you too!

If you are interested in learning, please email RuthShelbySmith1@aol.com to sign up for our September 3rd 10:30 to 11:30 am session or our September 23rd 1 to 2 pm session. Or both! Please also give her your phone number so that we can contact you during the session if you need additional instruction. We will also give you home phone numbers of members who you might want to call during the Training Session.

If you are already proficient on Zoom and would be able to help assist some members on the phone, please email DianeMillikin@gmail.com. At this time we don't know how many members we will need to help. And include your phone number too.

Once we have a list, we will send out an email with the link to join the Practice/Training session. If you do not have Zoom, please download this FREE app on your smartphone, tablet (like iPad or Kindle Fire), or personal computer. When you download this app, you do not need to set up an account. When we send you a link, you just click on it to join the meeting. When you are joining a Zoom meeting the first time, it will ask you to enter your

name. Once you have entered it, Zoom won't ask again.

It's important for us to know if you will be joining us using a family member's account or business account; we need to know what that name is in advance. We will be using a Waiting Room and will only admit members we are expecting. So if the account is under George Brown or ABC Company, we need to know in advance.

If you will be using a computer that does not have a camera or mic, you can join the Zoom meeting with your computer to see everyone and hear everyone. However, we will only see your name and you would need to type in the Chat box to communicate with us. You can also add your voice along with the computer by calling the phone numbers that will be provided with the link and then entering the Meeting ID and Password. So that there is no noise feedback doing this, please lower the volume on your computer. And that's another reason we need your phone number in advance: to allow you in.

We can go over this in the Practice/Training along with lots of helpful information like how to chat, turn off your mic, put up a virtual background, etc. Once you have done this a time or two, you will be a Pro!

Before joining the training, be sure to download the app to your PC, iPad, tablet or phone.

## **Zoom Etiquette for Everyone**

As we prepare to have many members on our upcoming meetings here are some suggestions to make it pleasant for everyone.

### Stage your video area

Keep in mind that people aren't just seeing you, they're also seeing whatever the camera is pointed at behind you or whoever else is in the room. If you can't position yourself so that there is a wall behind you, try using a virtual backdrop. You can join the training and assistance sessions above for help getting one set up.

### Stay on mute if you're not talking

Background noise can be really distracting. If you aren't sharing anything at the moment, go ahead and hit mute until you do. That way, no one has to listen to the car alarm that goes off in your neighborhood, your cell phone pinging or your neighbor's barking dog.
