Consider inviting a friend to join us. This is a great opportunity to showcase our good works for potential new members. My hope is that all members ask at least 1 new person to attend. Also, if you are a member of another organization, please ask if our event can be advertised in their newsletter or meetings. Contact Sonja for a flyer and a ready-made newsletter article.

Our AAUW community takes many hands and many hands make light work. We have a few jobs that need filling. Here are a few that take just a small amount of effort. Can you help?

- Zoom hosts: Do you like to attend our interesting programs? We need someone to "host" the zoom meetings. This means that you would open the Zoom about 15 minutes in advance of the meeting, "admit" attendees to the meeting, and occasionally help to mute or unmute participants. No prior experience is necessary, you just need a reliable internet connection. Don't worry, public speaking will not be required, and you'll get training. We need 2 people who can alternate.
- Storage Person: Do you have a small space in your garage where some historical records can be kept? These will eventually be scanned, but for the next year or two we need a space to store about 12 bankers' boxes. They can be stacked in 2-3 stacks, so just a 2 foot by 4-foot space is needed. The boxes would be delivered to you. Really, no effort required!
- <u>Page caller</u>: We need help contacting our members in advance of our program meetings. Just about 6 times a year we need someone who can call our members to remind them of events leaving a voice mail is ok. It would take about an hour per event. Can you help?
- <u>Email monitor</u>: We have a new email address: <u>aauwscv@gmail.com</u> We need a triage person who would receive emails and forward them on to the appropriate person. This is a very important job but takes hardly any time at all. You can even load our email to your cell phone and monitor it effortlessly.
- <u>Interested in more</u>? We have several board positions that need filling. If you are interested in getting more involved, we need volunteers of all different skillsets. Please let us know by March 30 if you'd like to learn more.


